

About the EU

- 27 Member States
- 9 candidate countries

Around 450 million citizens live in the EU.





- promotes peace, its values and the well-being of its citizens.
- offers freedom, security and justice without internal borders.
- ensures its citizens have the right to move and reside freely within the Union.
- enhances economic, social and territorial cohesion and solidarity among EU countries.


The EESC is...

An advisory body set up by the Treaty of Rome (1957).

It helps **shape laws and policies** by giving **advice to decision-makers** in the European Commission, the European Parliament and the Council of the European Union.


It ensures that adopted laws consider the **needs and opinions of** different groups with diverse backgrounds. It **represents European organised civil society**, comprised of groups and organisations in which people work cooperatively.

Its main role as an **advisory body** is to help EU institutions by **providing opinions** that reflect civil society's views into EU policies and decisions.



Who composes the EESC?

- 3 Groups: Employers, Workers and Civil Society Organisations.
 - 329 members (appointed for 5 years) representing the
 27 EU Member States.
 - EESC Members are not politically affiliated and are not based full-time in Brussels.
 - ± 200 opinions adopted per year.




What is an opinion?

- The European Parliament, the Council of the EU or the European Commission can ask the EESC for recommendations regarding legislation on a particular topic.
- The EESC members, representing all 3
 Groups, draw up a single document, called an "opinion", on the proposed legislation.
- After a consensus is reached, the EESC
 opinion is sent to the EU institutions to be
 discussed and published in the EU's Official
 Journal (24 languages).
- The rapporteur presents key findings and promotes the opinion at EU, Member State and local level.




Useful information

Number of members by country

As with other European institutions, the committee's **geographical representation is proportional**, meaning that more populous countries are allocated a greater number of members to represent them.

Therefore, France, Germany, and Italy have the most members (24), while Malta has the fewest (5).





Gender balance

The EESC's 2020-2025 term of office has the **highest number of female members** since statistics on membership began in 2010.

There is a higher percentage of women at the Committee than ever before: 33% compared to 28% in 2015 and 24.70% in 2010.

Explore

Thinking about a job in the EU institutions or another EU country?
Each year, the EU offers paid traineeships to young university graduates.



Speak

You can take part in youth events like the EU Youth Dialogue, the European Parliament's European Youth Event (EYE), and *Your Europe, Your Say!* at the European Economic and Social Committee.

There, you can make your voice heard!



Work

You can apply for jobs within the European Union when you are 18 years old.

The **EURES** scheme connects you with employers across EU, Norway and Iceland.



Study

You are entitled to study at any EU university under the same conditions as nationals of that country. The **ERASMUS** programme allows you to do part of your university studies abroad.



Travel

The border-free Schengen Area gives 400 million EU citizens free movement between countries.

For instance, the INTERRAIL train pass allows you to reach over 40 000 destinations in 30 countries.





EESC's Youth Offer

In September 2022, the EESC adopted the opinion *The EU Youth Test*, a tool designed to strengthen youth participation and mainstream youth perspectives in policy-making.

Following this, in July 2023 the **EESC Youth Group** was established, whose mandate is to:

- explore ways for young people to actively contribute to the Committee's work;
- foster open dialogue between EESC members and youth organisations.

What to expect?

Step 1. You will be divided into groups and take part in interactive workshops and inspiring talks by keynote speakers.

Step 2. Facilitators will guide sessions to help you articulate your vision and expectations for Europe's future.



Step 3. The event will culminate in a final plenary session where participants will translate their ideas into concrete recommendations.

Teachers will also have the opportunity to visit the House of European History, network with colleagues, and follow dedicated training and information sessions from other EU institutions with a concrete youth offer to share.



Outcome

The **EESC's Youth Group** will follow up by sharing the recommendations as **potential input** for advisory and political work carried out by the EESC, and explore how to integrate them in the selected opinions going through the **EU Youth Test**.



#YEYS2025 objectives

The EESC is hosting the **16**th **edition** of the **Your Europe**, **Your Say!** youth event.

This year, YEYS will:

- Empower youth and equip the participants with tools for participatory democracy.
- Encourage young participants to voice their concerns on EU issues.
- Inspire future civic engagement with the EU and their communities.
